#3 Core Routine: Silent Bell Task



Students will undertake a 'Silent Bell' task at the start of each lesson. This is a short activity used to activate prior learning to help the student learn new content in the lesson. Teachers may use mini whiteboards (pictured) to help deliver this activity to enable the teacher to make a quick assessment for learning

#4 Core Routine: Assemblies

The purpose of an assembly is to ensure that we have a calm and orderly start to each day. It is also an opportunity to reinforce our key values and highlight events of a local, national or international significance.

Students are expected to enter the hall in silence and remain in silence for the duration of the assembly.

The assembly will be delivered by a member of the Senior Leadership Team.
